We owe a big debt of gratitude to Cathy Lewis and Melora Jones for collecting and putting together all of the information required to obtain the grant. We are waiting for final plans for the project and look forward to starting construction on the pathways and landscaping this summer.

The purpose of the Coalition is to give a unified voice on matters where the University's planning and development will impact the member communities. 





THE CORNER STORE PROJECT

Tell us about your neighbourhood. There's been a shift in Edmonton's retail land-scape away from local community and neighbourhood shops. Shopping malls, mega commercial strips, and power centres with stand-alone big-box format stores dominate the shopping landscape. This shift has drawn people away from shopping in their own neighbourhood at local corner store businesses and small local shopping centres. As a result, there's been a decline in the number of neighbourhood stores and businesses, and a physical deterioration of many residential shopping sites.

The purpose of the Corner Store Project is to explore the actions the City might take to revitalize small neighbourhood shopping sites in mature neighbourhoods. The City of Edmonton wants to hear what you think about your neighbourhood shopping site and how you use them; specifically sites that are small with 3 to 10 shops and are located within or on the edge of a residential neighbourhood. Your information will guide us as we assist small businesses, property owners and residents to improve these centres and to make them valuable parts of your local community.

How do we get more families back into the core of our city?

Nearly all of the schools in our Ward (Downtown, University, Southgate, Riverbend) have fewer and fewer families living in surrounding neighbourhoods. Fewer students in the catchment areas put our schools at an ongoing risk of closure now and in the future.

As citizens, this is economically inefficient as these neighbourhoods are built for families. We have billions of dollars of infrastructure in the core of our city (including our playgrounds, schools, parks and pools, libraries, and roadways) but there are fewer families moving into our neighbourhoods. What can we do to bring more families back into Ward F?


