STRENGTHENING YOUR ORGANIZATION & FUNDING RESOURCES

Summer Temporary Employment Program (STEP)

- STEP is a 4 - 16 week wage subsidy program that provides funding to eligible Alberta employers to hire high school or post-secondary students into summer jobs from May to August.
- Summer positions created through STEP provide students with the opportunity to build meaningful work experience, increase their skills and workplace insight and help prepare them for the future.
- The employer applications are due **February 8, 2019**.

Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ)

- CSJ is an initiative of the Summer Work Experience program that provides funding to not-for-profit organizations, public-sector employers and small businesses with 50 or fewer full-time employees to create summer job opportunities for young people aged 15 to 30 years.
- New expanded eligibility now includes all youth aged 15-30, and is no longer restricted to students.
- Applications are **due by January 25, 2019**

Community, Culture and Recreation Infrastructure Grant (CIP)
