## REMINDERS

#### Permits for Events on City Parkland:

- For those of you who are planning Family Day events, please be aware that **permits are** required all year round for:
  - hosting events that have more than 50 attendees or
  - if you are using some type of vendor (e.g. sleigh rides, fireworks, etc.)
- Please note: This includes events that are held on licenced areas.
- If you are planning an outdoor event, please complete the <u>permit application</u> at least 4 weeks prior to the event date.

#### Skating Prohibited on Stormwater Lakes

- The City **Drainage Bylaw 18093** prohibits skating on **stormwater lakes**.
- Signage is posted at all stormwater facilities advising residents to keep off the ice because conditions are unknown.
- Ice conditions are unpredictable and dangerous.

- The Community League Infrastructure Program (CLIP) provides funding assistance to community leagues for:
  - capital costs to preserve and enhance existing facilities or
  - construction of new facilities that provide an overall benefit to the community and value to the citizens of Edmonton.
