#### What to do after an AGM?

Here are a few items to consider to start off your board term:

- File your <u>Annual Return</u> as a "Society" to Service Alberta (a.k.a. Corporate Registries), including a Notice of Special Resolution if you have passed new/amended Bylaws.
- Send updated board contact info to Service Alberta, EFCL, City of Edmonton (me!), and post on your website for your members
- Determine your new signing authorities and get them officially added to your bank account(s)
- Review organization goals/strategic plan, board job descriptions, annual budget, current projects with all board members
- Refresh your understanding of community leagues with the <u>EFCL's League</u> <u>Resource Guide</u>
- Refresh on general not-for-profit board member roles and responsibilities in the <u>booklets</u> or <u>tip sheets</u> from the Alberta Board Development program.

## Volunteer Connector

- is Edmonton's one-stop shop for volunteer opportunities
- Last year, the Edmonton Chamber of Voluntary Organizations (EVOC) launched volunteerconnector.org in Edmonton and the site had 11,857 unique users in Edmonton.
