ANNUAL EFCL CLOG Reporting

League Annual Reporting:

A friendly reminder to please complete your annual reporting. Submitting the report is a requirement in order to remain in good standing with both the EFCL and the City of Edmonton, and to receive 2023 Community League Operating Grant (CLOG) funding.

The portal to submit reports is open from <u>December 1, 2022 - March 1, 2023</u>.

Tripartite & Sublicense Agreements

Now that we are at the start of a new year, it is time to start submitting Sublicenses for third-party programs. The WinterCity Festival & Events Grant program and the application is now live.

<u>WinterCity Festivals and Events Grant Program | City of Edmonton</u>

Neighbourhood events are eligible. This grant is specifically to address the additional resources required to operate a winter event. (e.g. heaters, hot pockets, etc). Any logistical items that are specific to winter events.

Please make sure the events are eligible before you suggest groups to apply. The webpage has a lot of information on it that breaks down the grant.

To highlight a few of the criteria:

- Take place between January 1 and March 30, 2023 and/or November 15 and December 31, 2023
- Be an outdoor event primarily located in the public realm
- Held in-person with an attendance of 100 people or more
- The WinterCity Festivals & Events Grant allocations will vary based on the size, scope and scale of each event and will range from \$500 for smaller community events to up to \$60,000 for larger festivals and events. Grant funding may not exceed 25% of the total cost to produce the event.

Licensing for events on open space parkland and/or Licensed Land: As we transition to Fall, there are a lot of cozy ways to celebrate the change in seasons! As part of your event planning, please remember to submit your <u>license application</u> <u>4 weeks ahead</u>. This will ensure enough time to obtain activity-specific permissions such as fireworks, vending, alcohol or noise. We look forward to supporting you to host a successful event!

Single Use Plastic Bylaw

The Bylaw 20117 has been approved by City Council and will go into effect on July 1, 2023. **Edmonton's Single-use Item Reduction Bylaw** will help reduce waste by targeting items that can easily be replaced with reusable options or avoided altogether. Reducing

The Funding Program invests in projects, initiatives and events that encourage diverse and inclusive neighbourly connections, collaborations and partnerships.
