#### 1. Get Supplies

### Late June

Front Yards in Bloom will give you signs, brochures\*, and judging materials.

#### 2. Get Addresses

Received by July 3rd

Front Yards in Bloom will give you a list of nominated addresses by July 3<sup>rd</sup>. These are the nominated addresses in your neighbourhood.

3. Visit Yards

## July 4<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup>

Deadline: July 14th

Visit each nominated address (average: around 10-15). Deliver the sign and brochure. Also:

- A. Nominate any new/additional yards that deserve a nomination *(optional)* Deliver a sign and brochure. Write down the address(es).
- B. Choose:
  - top 2 yards (General category)
  - · top 2 Public Spaces yards

#### 4. Reply back to Front Yards in Bloom

- A. Provide addresses of new nominations
- B. Provide top 2 General and Public Spaces yards in your neighbourhood

\*brochures replace the certificate from previous years, and include a certificate on the back cover

Front Yards in Bloom will...

- Provide signs, brochures, and supplies for each nominated address
- Provide judging materials, and offer an optional training session (recommended for first-time judges)

#### Neighbourhood Renewal

It is no secret that the roadways and sidewalks throughout many communities in Edmonton are in need of rehabilitation. It is also no secret that Grandview is one of those neighbourhoods.

Currently, we have the capacity, both in terms of financial and industry capacity, to completely rehabilitate 5-6 of the 100 or so communities that are in need of rehabilitation every year.

Priority is determined by using our locally developed Risk Based Information Management System, which combines both technical and visual inspections of our infrastructure to determine the best allocation of resources.

For neighbourhood renewal, roadways and sidewalks through given a letter grade; as of 2011, Grandview's roads were given a 'D' grade and sidewalks were given a 'B' grade (it is important to note that these are neighbourhood wide averages, and some sections of roadway or sidewalk may be in better or worse condition than the letter grade the neighbourhood receives).

Grandview's infrastructure will be reassessed this year. Currently, Grandview is tentatively scheduled to receive renewal during the 2019-2022 cycle.

As contracts are tendered years in advance, and are scheduled as part of the 2015-2018 Capital Budget deliberations that occurred in December of last year, the earliest we will see complete neighbourhood renewal in Grandview is 2019.

My hope is that the reassessment will show that Grandview is in need of repair, and I will advocate to ensure that Grandview's renewal is at the top of the list for 2019.

#### South Campus

Recently, the University of Alberta developed a land trust that will steward the development of some of their vacant land holdings throughout the City - the West 240 likely included.

#### Residential Infill

As many of you are aware, Council recently passed amendments to our Zoning Bylaw that allows for Garage & Garden Suites on all single-family lots and for the subdivision of 50 foot lots to 25 foot

When I came to your community late last year, I was able to gather feedback, and hear your concerns about the amendments to the Zoning Bylaw; these questions and concerns were later reinforced at the Public Hearing through the presentations made from members of your community.

I continue to believe that these amendments are good for the City as a whole, and that they will help us address the growth pressures we are facing. I also continue to believe that, based on each community are completely inspected every 4 years, and are the history of development in the neighbourhood, these amendments are unlikely to see uptake in Grandview.

> That being said, I've heard from you that you wish to maintain the character of your neighbourhood, and I'm confident that the best way to do that is through our Mature Neighbourhood Overlay.

> I also believe that by working with the University of Alberta's land trust to develop the West 240, much of the densification will be focused on that land, rather than within Grandview or Lansdowne, thus preserving your community's special character.
