- Please remember that this service is not part of their regular mowing duties and is provided as a complimentary extra as time permits. Conditions such as weather or the availability of equipment may have an impact as to how often your rink is mowed.

### Safety is the point: Needle Disposal Campaign Kicks Off

Let's face it: no one likes to see needles on the ground. But do you always know what to do should you find one? It depends!

- If you see a needle in a public space (park, alley, sidewalk), call 3-1-1 or report it using the 311 App. City staff aim to collect and dispose of the needle(s) within 2 hours of the call between 8am and 4pm, 7 days a week.
- But what if you find a needle on your property? Check the link above for step-by-step instructions to help you safely collect the needle.

### Spot It Report It Remove It

The City of Edmonton is on the hunt for noxious weeds asking residents to SPOT, REPORT and REMOVE invasive weeds from their property and urban natural areas. These plants can:

- Grow and spread quickly, invading crops and entire ecosystems
- Out compete our native plants
- Infest streams, riverbanks and waterways
- Reduce native biodiversity

The City of Edmonton's Outreach Team will be visiting Garden Centres and going door to door this summer to help residents learn about how they can participate in the campaign.

## **PROGRAMS, EVENTS & LICENSES**

### Permits for Events on City Parkland (including in Community League licensed areas)

- For those of you who are planning outdoor events, please be aware that permits are required if:
  - You are hosting an event that has more than 50 attendees, or
  - You are using some type of vendor at the event (e.g. wagon rides, inflatables, food service, portable toilets, fireworks, tents, etc.)
- Important: This **includes** events that are held on licensed areas, such as Community League licensed areas from the Tripartite Agreement.
- If you are planning an outdoor event, please complete the <u>permit application</u> at least 4 weeks prior to the event date.


### **Play Streets Guide**

- The idea of a Play Street is to bring neighbours together and allow use of a space which is not normally inviting for celebration or play.
- The City supports Play Streets through planning, operational and permitting support. Explore the new how-to guide for organizing a play street on your block!

#### Run Walk Ride for Vision Zero

- June 8, 2019 at Concordia University along Ada Boulevard to Rundle Park
- This fun, family-friendly event is all about promoting the importance of traffic safety in our community for everyone: pedestrians, cyclists, motorcyclists and drivers. Join the 2k or 5k run/walk, 10k run and 10k family-fun cycle event.
- <u>Vision Zero</u> is the long-term goal of zero traffic fatalities and serious injuries. Net proceeds from the race benefit the Memorial and Traffic Safety Fund which helps to support traffic safety research and community traffic-safety initiatives.

#### National Indigenous Peoples' Day



- In Canada, June 21 is designated as <u>National Indigenous Peoples Day</u>, a celebration of Indigenous Peoples' culture and heritage. This date was chosen because it corresponds to the summer solstice, the longest day of the year, and because for generations, many Indigenous Peoples' groups have celebrated their culture and heritage at this time of year.
- National Indigenous Peoples Day is a wonderful opportunity to become better acquainted with the cultural diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples; and to discover the unique accomplishments of Indigenous Peoples.
- On June 22, 2019, the <u>Edmonton's Indigenous Peoples Festival</u> will fill the Edmonton Expo Centre! First Nation, Métis and Inuit peoples and cultures will be celebrated through interactive experiences, cultural demonstrations, artisans, cuisine and live concerts.

- This initiative focuses on increasing tree planting within the city through continued partnerships with businesses, individual residents, and community groups.
- The annual target of this initiative is to plant an additional 45,000 trees.

## City of Edmonton Pest Management Program

- Have you ever been curious as to where the City is applying pesticides on a particular day and for what purpose?
- Two new tools will show citizens where City crews plan to apply pesticides as well as where crews have already treated for mosquitoes: <u>The Pesticide Public Notification Map</u> and GPS technology to record where helicopter and truck crews have treated for mosquitoes.
- The City's pest management programs help control the spread of noxious and prohibited noxious weeds, invasive tree insects, mosquitoes and other types of pests and weeds.
- The City focuses on minimizing the use of pesticides while ensuring the maximum effectiveness of its pest management programs.
