- 2019 also marks the 30 anniversary of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.
- The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child sets out the rights of children within 54 articles that provide us with a solid road map of what is needed to raise healthy and happy children and youth.

Don't Forget to Check if Your Events on City Parkland Need a Permit

- Permits are required year-round for hosting events on City of Edmonton parkland with more than 50 attendees or if you are using some type of vendor (e.g. sleigh rides, fireworks, food vendors, etc.).
- Please note: This includes events that are held on licenced areas as well as surrounding parkland.
- If you are planning an outdoor event, please complete the permit application at least 4 weeks prior to the event date.

Government of Canada Anti-Racism Action Program

- The Anti-Racism Action Program is one important means by which the Government of Canada implements <u>Canada's Anti-Racism Strategy</u>.
- The Anti-Racism Action Program is intended to help address barriers to employment, justice and social participation among Indigenous Peoples, racialized communities and religious minorities.
- Eligible projects include ones that focus on social participation: promoting participation and reducing barriers in community sports, arts and culture.

Planning a New Event or Activity?

 As we approach the end of the year and the onset of winter, you might have an idea for a new event or activity in your neighbourhood that is free to the public. Don't forget to talk to your NRC to find out what resources might be available to you (e.g. planning help, equipment loaning, possible partners, funding).

Equipment Loaning Program

- If you're planning a holiday or winter event, don't forget that the City has equipment, games and kits that you can borrow for a nominal fee.
- The fee for loaning equipment is \$5 per kit (plus GST) and the borrowing period is from Wednesday (pick-up) to Tuesday (return).
- Check out the <u>equipment catalog</u>, and submit your <u>request</u>.
- Requests can be made as early as three months in advance and up to two weeks prior to the requested dates.
